Rules for "Champion of Champions" competition

Revised 6 March 2020

Objective

The objective of this competition is to encourage greater participation in NVA club competitions. There is no better way of improving your flying skills by practicing for, and entering, competitions.

The scoring involves points being awarded for entering a competition with extra points added depending on the pilot's position at the end of the competition.

To qualify as an entrant the pilot must register their name with the organiser and attempt a take-off or launch. This means that a pilot that takes off and then crashes their plane within seconds, still qualifies as an entrant. The pilot must have entered in good faith. Where a competition comprises "rounds", the contestant does not have to attempt all rounds in order to qualify as an entrant.

The winner of the Champion of Champions prize is the pilot who has the greatest number of total points at the end of the contest year, 31 October.

Points to be awarded as follows:

- *All entrants are awarded 5 points
- *The winner of the competition is awarded an additional number of points equal to the number of entrants plus 2.
- *Pilots that are placed behind the winner are awarded an additional number of points equal to the number of entrants plus 2, minus their position number.
- *Pilots that do not complete the competition (retire, disqualified etc.) are awarded no additional points.

Example for a competition that has 8 entrants (but 2 retire)

Winner receives	15 points	(5+8+2)
2 nd place receives	13 points	(5+8+2-2)
3 rd place receives	12 points	(5+8+2-3)
4 th place receives	11 points	(5+8+2-4)
5 th place receives	10 points	(5+8+2-5)
6 th place receives	9 points	(5+8+2-6)

Non-finishers 5 points each
